I have broad experience in supporting scholars in the process of drafting research proposals for the National Science Centre in Poland (NCN). I have contributed to the success of over 20 research proposals and supported over seventy other proposals in various calls of the National Science Centre (NCN). I have experience in planning research with experienced scholars (Maestro and Opus programmes), postdocs (Sonata and Sonatina programmes), PhD candidates (Preludium programme) and in minor research actions (Miniatura programme).
